WESTERN MUSIC

"Music gives a soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination, and life to everything." - Plato

Music has a power that moves people from all strata and cultures. Music is present all around us, be it on TV or in movies, or in various ceremonies like weddings, birthdays, or while worshipping god. In the early 1990s, a team of researchers emphasized that exposure to music in early childhood helps children develop a larger vocabulary, speak more clearly, develop social and emotional skills, and strengthen the connection between body and brain. Here, today we will look into Western Music - one of the oldest forms of music.

Western Music

The history of western music is rooted in Greeks and Romans. The word western refers to European traditions and social structures as primarily formed by European Immigrants settled in America. Western music is part of these traditions and can be defined as "Organized Instrumentation and sound created in Europe and European immigrants settled in America and other places around the world."

Western Music includes a wide variety of genres from classical western music, jazz, rock to country music.



1. Classical Music

Music composed between the post-Baroque and pre-romantic era is classified under classical music. The main focus in classical music is on Opera singing and classical symphonies. Similar to classical Indian music, Classical Western music requires patience and effort from the listener to fully understand the balance of the beautiful symphonies and appreciate it.

2. Pop Music

The first name that POPs in everyone's head is 'Micheal Jackson, King of Pop'. The Genre of Pop music or Popular Music began in the late 90s to early 2000. The advent of reality show helped Pop music to be recognized as a separate genre. The popularity of this genre is due to the fact that you do not need a deep understanding of technical aspects to enjoy this music. All you need is a good ear for music. Pop music is further divided into two sub-genres –

- Blues influenced by African music brought to the United States by African slaves in the early 18th and 19th centuries. It was predominately sad and slow music sung by slaves to make their work and lives easy. Later after slavery was abolished some immigrants sang it as Hymns and some turned it into dance tunes and thus developed new styles Jazz, Hip Hop, R&B, and Soul.
- Jazz developed in southern states in the late 19th century. One of the forms of music very close to Indian classical music. It is a celebration of the amalgamation of western classical, African music European harmony, and the blues scale.
- R&B (Rhythm & Blues)- as the name suggests, music derived from blues but with rhythm.



- Rock one of the most popular forms of music is an amalgamation of Blues, elements of jazz, and country music.
- Hip Hop the most famous kind of music among millennials. Although developed in the 1970s it became famous in the 21st century. It had become synonyms with rapping and beatboxing and has been having a lot of influence on pop music culture.

3. Country Music

Earlier known as 'Hillbilly Music' because of its roots in the countryside. This form of genre has a heavy influence on European influence. It was born by immigrants of various countries who settled in the Appalachian mountain area. This form of music consists of straightforward memorable stories sung and supported by harmonica, banjo, or guitar.





WESTERN Vocals

Have you ever sung may be in your school play or between friends or just Happy Birthday for a family or friend? They all form a part of Vocal music. Vocal music is a form of music that highlights and uses the Human Voice maybe with the support of some instruments. Vocal music has been there for thousands of years and is found in different forms across the world. Western Vocals from a part of western music. Here are some terms which you need to familiarize yourself in Western Vocal Music –

- Monophonic a single-line melody. One of the early examples of Monophonic is back to 900 AD.
- **Polyphonic** several melodies are sung at the same time.
- **Cappella** an Italian term earlier used for religious music done with voices only. Cappella is a form of music that uses only human voices.
- Choral works music specially created for a group of people where pieces re-sung by many singers.

Individuals pursuing western vocals can take part in Operas, musicals where stories are told by vocalists who play different roles in the musicals, jazz vocals, funk, rock, and pop songs sung by famous artists such as Beyonce, Lady Gaga, or Beatles.

Our last edition covered the Benefits of Playing the Guitar. A lot is written on guitar but have you ever wondered where Guitar originated or who invented it? Let us answer these questions. "The guitar is derived from the word 'Guitarra Latina' is said to have originated in Spain in the early 16th century. It was derived from a late medieval instrument known as Lute. The early guitar was narrower and deeper like a 'Vihuela'."

The Evaluation of Modern Guitar – the earliest guitar had four-course strings. The instrument underwent major changes from the 16th century to the 19th century. A fifth and sixth-course string was added. The body underwent changes in the 19th century and by the early 20th century, the modern guitar was born. The guitar is widely used in folk and popular music.

Different Types of Guitar and find out which one is for you –

Acoustic Guitars – the simple guitar with which most people are familiar. They are ideal for beginners and sing-songwriters.

Electro-Acoustic Guitars – which come with a built-in microphone that can be plugged into amplifiers. Ideal for live shows.

Semi-Acoustic Guitars – a middle ground between acoustic and electric guitars. Ideal for players looking for versatility as they are thin like an electric guitar but at the same time hollow like an acoustic guitar.

PIANO

The piano was first invented by Bartolomeo Cristofori in Padua Italy. Cristofori was unsatisfied with the lack of control over the volume level of Harpsichord (ancestor of piano). He switched out the plucking mechanism from Harpsichord and replaced it with a hammer to create modern Piano in the year 1700.

Did you know there are several skills which you are enhancing that helps you be more successful in other areas? Here is a list of skills that you can master by playing the beautiful instrument –

- Teaches Perseverance learning a new song and playing it to perfection on the piano is no small feat. This helps you to increase perseverance the skill which helps you take up difficult tasks.
- **Sharpens concentration** playing the piano is a multi-level concentration exercise as you have to focus on pitch, tone, rhythm, and several other things.
- Teacher Discipline being a successful piano player means you have to practice, practice and practice. This needs dedication and discipline thus instilling discipline.
- Improves Emotional Intelligence piano players have enhanced listening skills which makes them more perceptive in interpreting the emotions of others.

The above enhancement of skills is definitely a huge booster for taking up those tricky piano lessons.

Faculty - Podium PIANO Course Artist & Performer







SPOTLIGHT RITU G & SARA G

On the occasion of the 7th anniversary of the hugely successful JAMMs (Journey About Mast Moms), a social support community of like-minded and enterprising *Mast Moms*, we dive deep into the mind and heart of its Founder Ritu G.

A single parent, skilled, capable and very talented Ritu has led the 50,000+ momforce into camaraderie and fun and has created avenues for women from all walks of life to learn, engage and grow as individuals as well as mothers.

Here is an interview with the diva herself, mother, social entrepreneur and inspiration.

The journey of JAMMs how was this mother's network started? How did you set it up?

JAMMs essentially started when I moved back to Mumbai. After staying away for 8 years I moved back to a different part of Mumbai. 
What has been your journey as a Parent which inspired the creation of Hey Cloudy?
